5 NAG Priority Anti Social behavior/ Criminal damage update

5a Flackwell Heath Web Site

The FH web site has an article/statement that needs to be removed and a new statement /article composed and submitted. Sgt, A Deane to follow up.

5b There were general discussions around illegal use of motorbikes and ASB around the Heath End Rd/Magpie Lane areas of FH

5c Continuing ASB at Magpie Lane FH and Mr Farley's fence in Magpie Lane were raised. The Chairman is to approach Chepping Wycombe Parish Council, to get help with the bushes & a draft letter to look over & sent out.? !!!!

5d Peter Cartwright asked about possible ASB on Halloween night and the Grim Reaper operation. Sgt Deane replied that the local police teams would be doing early evening patrols of all local areas and communicating with local shops on the sale of eggs and flour to young people. Sgt. Deane also informed the meeting that there is a new fire communications officer, who is organising projects with local schools and community groups, and using local web sites and the Ringmaster Messaging system.

5e Sgt. Deane gave an update on operation Gainful in Flackwell Heath / Loudwater/Tylers Green and Hazlemere. Suspects from the areas of Langley, Bracknell & Wembley have been arrested & charged to appear in court. Sgt, Deane mentioned about click and check on car key fobs, and that cars are being cherry picked for spare parts.IE Catalytic Convertors

6, NAG Priority-Speeding/Road Safety update

6a Sgt, Deane reported Flackwell Heath have completed 2 Community Speedwatch [CSW] operations and the data had been analysed. Some data was lost due to inaccurate recording which affected the overall results.

17/10/2011 8am- 9.30am Details of 55 vehicles were taken, that exceeded the prosecutable speed limit of 35mph+. CSW warning letters have been sent out

21/10/2011 3pm -4.45pm Details of 27 vehicles were taken, that exceeded the prosecutable speed limit of 35mph+ CSW warning letters have been sent out

An article for the FH Grapevine magazine, and the FH Website will be produced.

6b Over the last 6 months 800 letters have been sent out to speeding drivers and the police have issued 12 section 59 warnings.

8a Fennels wood FH – BMX area

9a It has been noticed that Ringmaster Messaging System has now changed, with Alan Clements going, and a new lady called Claire Gurley has taken up the task of sending the messages out. Sandy Macdiarmid complained that the service is no longer giving out local news, but from the whole of the Wycombe area. It was decided after a lengthily discussion that the chairman to write a letter to Chief Inspector Seaton on the issue, that the membership is not happy with how the current messages are being sent out.
