Issues affecting Flackwell Heath

Anti-Social Behaviour/Crime

- BMX bikers have been causing problems on Aries Parade FH,

Speeding/Road Safety

- The Speed Indicator device [SID] has now been repaired, and further Community Speedwatch sessions can now be planned
- From a NAG initiative, Chepping Wycombe Parish Council are to supply 30mph Wheelie Bin Signs for roads where Speeding Traffic is a problem.
- The NAG committee will be recommending to Chepping Wycombe Parish Council that Moveable Vehicle Activated Signs [MVAS] Flashing Speed Signs are purchased, to educate drivers to slow down on Treadaway Hill, and other through Roads suffering from Speeding Traffic
- County Councillor Mike Appleyard and a recently formed FH Traffic Group are looking at ways to improve Traffic Calming on Straight Bit FH.
- A further consultation with local residents, is being planned to resolve the on-going parking problem, and providing Double Yellow Lines in Chapel Road FH.

CNPT

- The name of the local Neighbourhood Policing Team, has been changed to Chepping/ Wye Valley Neighbourhood Policing Team [CNPT]

Youth Involvement

- BMX Facilities. With the purchase of Oakwood by Chepping Wycombe Parish Council, a BMX workshop was held recently, to investigate possibly having a BMX rough riding track in Oakwood. The NAG committee hope this will reduce the problems of Anti- Social behaviour, at the Recreation Ground Straight Bit
