



Hazlemere/Chepping Wycombe Neighbourhood Action Group [NAG]

Update from the NAG 24.07.13

- 1) Karen Adamson from Adult & Family Social Care BCC, and Lawrence Eldridge of Trading Standards BCC, gave interesting presentations of their organisations and roles
- 2) David Watson the new Bucks County Councillor for Flackwell Heath, Little Marlow, and Marlow South East Ward also gave a short presentation and update, on the current position with the Double Yellow Lines in Chapel Road FH,
The NAG voted in favour to support David Watson's proposal for Double Yellow lines down the Church side of Chapel Road. It is hoped this will now lead to a conclusion to the long running issue.
- 3) **NAG Priority: Anti-Social Behaviour/Criminal Damage update.**
 - There had been 14 reported cases of Anti- Social behaviour. The Police are aware, and more police time will be spent in the area, including the Mobile Police Office visiting FH on the 11th and 12th of July
 - **Burglary:**
There had only been one reported case of an attempted burglary in FH
No one has yet been arrested following the break I at Unit 4
- 4) **NAG Priority: Speeding / Road safety.**
 - Speed enforcement had been carried out on Straight Bit FH. 17 vehicles were measured at 10% over the 30mph. This low figure was questioned, and could have been down to the SID being placed too close to the Recreation Ground and the Traffic Island there.
 - **MVAS Project: Moveable Vehicle Activated Speed Signs[Flashing Speed Signs]**
The NAG proposal to CWPC to part fund the project, has now been approved. Further donations from our County and District Councillors are still being sort, for phase 2 of the project, for another MVAS.
The FHRA have been agreed to fund the 4 Groundscrews for the four sites chosen in FH.
 - **30mph Wheelie Bin Signs:**
These have now all been delivered to suitable houses requesting them from CWPC, and to houses on roads with known speeding problems.
The FHRA are considering purchasing further supplies of the 30MPH Wheelie Bin stickers
- 5) **CNPT: Staff changes.**
 - Sergeant Matthew Lloyd has now been appointed and taken up his new role as Sergeant in charge of the Chepping Wye Valley Neighbourhood Policing Team [CNPT] based in the Hazlemere Police Office.
Inspector Scott Messenger has also been appointed, replacing Inspector Ray Wilks who has retired.
The Deputy PCC had been invited to attend a NAG meeting, and attended the NAG meeting in April
 - **Community Speedwatch:** Volunteers from residents are being sort for the next Community Speedwatch event in Straight Bit FH
 - **A Road Safety Week** is planned later in the year, involving the NAG members, and hopefully local schools, the Police, NHW and residents, to launch the MVAS project
